2 Man's Disobedience

Adam and Eve's disobedience was brought about by deception and a desire that went against God's command. Because of man's disobedience, sin entered the world and corrupted God's plan. Instead of eternal life, man inherited sin, and with it spiritual and physical death. Man's sin affects the whole world, which results in societal problems. Even though we try to be the kindest person in the world and not sin, we fall short. There is nothing we can do to be sinless and blameless before the world and before God. According to Hebrews 9:22, what is the only way that sin can be forgiven?

3 The King's Response

*⁹But the Lord God called to the man and said to him, "Where are you?" . . . ²¹And the Lord God made for Adam and for his wife garment of skins and clothed them. **GENESIS 3:9,21***

God sought Adam in spite of his disobedience and gave him a chance to repent. However, Adam did not admit to his disobedience and even blamed Eve for the sin he had also committed. They tried to cover their sin with fig leaves, a temporary solution; God clothed Adam and Eve with animal skin, thus making the first sacrifice for sin (Genesis 3:21). But God desires for all of mankind to be forgiven and reconciled to Him, which is why He sent Jesus Christ to be the perfect sacrifice for the sins of the world once for all (1 John 2:1,2). How did the way you live change knowing that your sins are forgiven through Christ's sacrifice?
